\$178,000*

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This funding will be used to

- 85 % of students achieving a C or above in English, Mathematics and Science
- All students with an Individual Curriculum Plan (ICP) achieving a C or above
- Upper 2 Bands Numeracy - Year 3 - 35%, Year 5 - 25%
- Naplan NMS Numeracy - year 3 - 95% year 5 - 95%
- 100% of teaching staff and leadership engaging in intentional collaborative work within and across schools
- Maintain extra targeted teacher aide support

Our initiatives include

- Building capability in teachers to implement the Australian Curriculum through a clear and sequenced curriculum, assessment and moderation plan through professional collaboration and team development
- Embed the culture, climate, processes and protocols of classroom observation and feedback to support professional growth and encourage reflective practices
- Provide release time for teachers to work in teams on targeted programs including curriculum development, professional learning teams and devising support plans for individuals and small groups
- Implement visible learning 3 year plan
- Resources for visible learning work to support student engagement and school priorities
- Embed Sharrett's "Five Questions for Students" to provide feedback to staff members and provide students with an opportunity to articulate their learning and give feedback to staff members
- Use the Early Start resources to benchmark students in prep and build student support from Early Start Data
